There will be additional lesson titles as this class period series advances. On Wednesday evening a Bible class book on the book of Revelation is being used. As a side note, as discussions in the book of Revelation go, I'm not certain how long this study is going to take. It could take a long while to complete. We're a congregation prone to long – lengthy discussions.

We continue to participate in our Daily Bible Reading. We have great participation from all of the members.

We've had a few visitors pass through our area in recent weeks and they have been a great encouragement to us.

I will begin a new series of lessons two weeks from now. Now that Spring Break is over it will be good to have everyone back with us. Many of our members have been traveling due to the time of year. One of our members travels quite often on business this time of year.

As for an update on the sister-in-Christ who has cancer. Things are not looking good. Her latest report was that the cancer has spread to the lungs. The prognosis from the doctors is not very good at this time. We continue to pray for her and her family.

Thank you for your continued fellowship in the gospel here in this place. You continue to be a huge encouragement to me and my family. Thank you so much. We believe that the work here that we are trying to do in the Lord's Kingdom is a very important work, and your help is so very appreciated.
