Rome, September 13, 2016

Dear brethren in the Lord,

my wife and I hope to find all of you in good physical and spiritual health. Firs of all, we would like to thank you for your precious fellowship, which allows us to divulge the gospel also in Rome. Our field is difficult, due to radical traditionalism, but with your help we will keep on hoping to reach as many as possible to Christ.

PERSONAL NEWS. Thanking God, we're all doing fine. Our granddaughter Alicia is growing (4 months old) in good health and the same is for our grandson Alessandro (almost 2 years old). Both of them are doing fine. Our daughter Valeria is also doing well: busy, tired but happy. Our son Paolo is still working at Bologna for the Ryan Air aircraft. Often he comes down to Rome to visit all of us.

My wife Antonella is improving month by month after test and radiotherapies as result of her thyroid tumor. In November she will have to go under other test to check up the situation.

My parents are also doing OK. My dad Sandro (90 years old) is in fair condition, considering the natural problems at his age. He slowed down his translating work but still at work as long as energy will allow him to keep on the important work for the progress of the gospel here in Italy. In fact, his writings are of great help for many Christian of this Country. We freely give the commentary translated by him to all the ones that make request for a better personal Bible knowledge. My mother Elisabetta (88 years old) instead has more difficulties. She barely walks and sustained by a lot of medical cares. Everyday she is assisted by a nurse.
