Thank you for your support, it is very much appreciated. Following is my report for **April 2017**.

PREACHED AT ULVERSTONE.

This month Jackie and I drove 110 kms Ulverstone for to me to preach for the church there . Because the man who does all the preaching and teaching was away on the mainland, I was required to lead the Lord's Supper and lead public prayers as well as preach.

SAD SHOCKING DEVELOPMENT.

The members at Eastside were profoundly shocked this month when Kane Keleher asked to address the church at the close of worship . He written announcing he no longer read a statement wanted to attend Florida College.

Nobody saw this coming, and we had no hint that he had changed thoughts his mind about Florida College, as he had confided his not anyone. When he finished speaking he broke down crying and state to discuss with us why he had made this decision. was in no

Several days later I received an email from the man in the U.S. who was organising sponsorship for Kane to attend Florida College, and attached to this email was a letter Kane had written to him, explaining his reasons for "opting out" of Florida College.

Again, nobody at Eastside had seen, or even was aware that Kane had sent this letter to all the people in the U.S. who had anything to do with facilitating his enrolment at Florida College. This letter shed a lot of light as to how Kane was thinking when he made this decision.

I then had opportunity to have a private chat with Kane, and I commended him on the composition of his letter, but expressed that I wish he had confided in us at Eastside about his reservations before dropping the "bombshell".

Discussions with Kane are ongoing, and the picture that is emerging is that it was too daunting and even terrifying a prospect for this 16 year old to fly 14,000 away from home to a strange land, be among people he does not know, and lay in bed at night knowing he could not get on a Metro bus and visit his mum whenever he wanted to.

MY FEAR RE KANE.

Several months ago Kane started work after school and Saturdays and Sunday afternoons at a fast - food restaurant, and for the first time in his life he has his own money (considerable amount), and is mixing with people other than his school classmates, people who have no interest whatsoever in spiritual matters.

Almost every weekend Kane used to go bushwalking and cycling with Viktor Koskovic and Brett Anderson (two fanatically faithful members at Eastside, 50 and 60 year olds), but this month he has opted out several times of going with Viktor and Brett, instead preferring to work or engage in activities with young people his own age from the fast food outlet.

This month for the first time ever he did not attend the Camp Barnabas

Lectures because "he had to work" at the fast food outlet. One Sunday this month he even phoned Jackie on Sunday morning to say he would not be at worship because his boss had phoned him and said that he was desperately short of staff and needed Kane to help him out.

Several of the Eastside members (including me) had very serious discussions with Kane about missing worship for this reason, pointing out to Kane that if Kane did not exist his boss would be able to find someone else.

We also stressed that when you give up your principles re worship just once, people will expect you to do it all the time. Kane was very remorseful and promised he would tell his boss that he would no longer be available to work on Sunday mornings.

MY FEAR.

My fear is that Kane is dazzled by the lure of earning "big" money, is flattered by the popularity he enjoys from his peers at the fast food outlet (he has made an amazing impression on his boss and all the staff) and will be drawn away from spirituality and succumb to worldliness.

The problem is compounded by the fact that Kane has absolutely nobody at Eastside anywhere near his age, the next oldest person is in his late forties, and the rest are 60's and 70 year olds.

Please pray for Kane, but also for Jackie and I as we struggle with deep frustration and discouragement right now.

CAMP BARNABAS LECTURES.

This year was the smallest attendance figure ever, since we began "Barnabas" in 1997. This was due to the fact that no mainland brethren came this year (they come every second year) and a large family of eight who always bring <u>another</u> seven or eight people from their community, they moved to Brisbane early this year.

REQUEST FOR BULK BOOKLETS.

I received an email this month from a preacher in South Africa, requesting ten (10) copies of my Lesson Booklet, "We must be a separate people", and ten (10) copies of, "Three things that God will never do".

The Eastside church has volunteered to pay the postage (about \$80.00) as part of the church's foreign evangelism program. I am starting to put more of my lessons onto Eastside's Web Page, but brethren around the world do not want just the printed page. They say that my bound coloured booklets with accompanying illustrations are far more effective to hand out to others.

FUNERAL SERVICE REQUEST.

This month the husband of my female cousin died suddenly as he walked out of the holiday home they had been staying at. The family asked me to conduct the funeral service.

This cousin deliberately "matched me up" with my wife Jackie on a blind date about 55 years ago, and we have been close friends for all that time.

Our Australian Rules Football season has begun, meaning every second Saturday (home game days), Jackie and I work in the Hillwood Football Club's canteen from 7 am.

The Literacy Program at the school where Eastside meets, has started well for 2017. Jackie has children from the same class she had last year, but I have been allocated a different class than 2016.

Every Tuesday for one hour we teach young children to read, but the teachers have stressed that building a relationship with the pupils is equally as important.
