Rome, July 22, 2019

Dear brethren in the Lord,

my wife Antonella and I hope to find each one of you enjoying all material and spiritual blessing in God's mercy. We'd like to express our deep feelings of gratefulness for all you're doing in our behalf, allowing our preaching of the gospel also in Rome, the world center of modern paganism, masked by false Christianity. In spite of our society background, we're continuing to proclaim the Truth, trying to find good people interested in the Bible and in salvation. We ask your comprehension and endurance in order to continue in all this.

PERSONAL NEWS. We are doing fine. Our two grandchildren, Alessandro (5 years next October) and Alice (3 years) are growing and more involved in our talking and thinking. They are funny in the way they express their views.

Our daughter Valeria is waiting for the third baby (she's within her six month). All is proceeding fine with no big diseases. She's doing OK. The baby is a boy and will be named Samuele. Extra work is coming for all!
