We have started reading the book of Hebrews for our Friday morning community study. Hebrews is also the book we chose this year for our repetitive reading schedule. We publish this schedule on our website and in our bulletin, and plan to read the book through 12 times this year. I have started a new online study around this reading schedule, and have enjoyed connecting with some folks across the country as we study. We've had folks from West Virginia, Virginia, and Kentucky (as well as here in Montana) participate in the study.

I am continuing the study, "Walking Worthy of Your Calling" on Sunday mornings. I'm a bit behind in updating the website with the material, but I think the study itself

is going very well. We have spent quite a bit of time in Romans 12 over the last few weeks, looking at what Paul describes as the image of a true Christian. I am planning to move on into chapters 13-15 before changing the format over to particular topics that Christians need to be diligent about.

Justin has been continuing his study in 1 Samuel through January. As he is wrapping that study up, he is planning to start a new study soon in the Minor Prophets.

I continue to have ongoing studies and discussions with my friend Jim. Overall, he seems to be doing well, though I know there are some very serious times that lie ahead for him. He has been very successful thus far in overcoming his alcohol addiction, and has become very focused on doing right by his family, especially his daughters. We are still trying to break down his preconceived notions about "religion" and what the Bible teaches on various things (such as initial salvation). But the door continues to be open, and I am trying to take full advantage of the opportunity. Continued prayers on his behalf are much appreciated!
