I hope that your summer is going as well as can be expected with the current pandemic impacting the country. We continue to be blessed with a relatively low impact of the illness in our area. We have had less than 1600 confirmed cases thus far, but the numbers are going up now due to the number of tourists that have come to the state. Montana loosened restrictions on June 1st, and so now people are allowed to enter the state without the previous 14 day quarantine. While these consequences were expected, it is clear that it is unreasonable to think that the virus was simply going to disappear, and the goal never was to keep every person from getting sick. Like most places, our medical facilities are doing well, and not threatened to be overrun, so it appears that things are as well as could be possible for now!

Recently, I have mentioned some of the folks we have been studying with. One of those, Bridgette, has been very zealous in our studies. Last week, she made the decision to be baptized into Christ. Most of the congregation was able to meet at the Gallatin River and rejoice with her. We are happy to have Bridgette with us, and look forward to seeing her growth in the future!

Larissa, another lady who has been studying with us regularly for a few months, ended up moving to San Diego, CA. She continued to study with us over Zoom

for the next few weeks. Recently, Mike received a text from her saying that she had moved to Charleston, WV. Because of the time difference and her new job schedule, she would not be able to study with us regularly. We were able to put her into contact with the brethren in Huntington (where I was working before moving to Montana) and they have been able to connect to study. I had been trying to find someone who was willing to study with her down in San Diego, but had not yet found someone, so it was providential for her to find a job near the good brethren in Huntington. I pray they will be able to continue to work with Larissa, and that she will choose to submit to God's will!

I have been studying with my friend Jim's father and step-mother over zoom for a while. Recently, I contacted Dale Pennock, a friend and gospel preacher in Vermont (where the Leaches live) in hopes that they would be able to get together and study in person. Dale has been joining in on our regular Zoom study on Friday mornings, and has been a good addition to that effort. I have enjoyed these studies immensely, and pray for continued benefit from it.

Other studies continue to go well. We have several contacts that we have regular opportunities with, and remain hopeful that they will open their hearts to the gospel message. We are thankful for the doors of opportunity that God has opened to us, and pray that we are able to do our part in sharing His word with them!
