Between the visitors, sickness, and being very busy, I have simply fallen behind by a few days on getting tasks completed.

The work here continues to be busy and exciting. Studies with Bridgette and Jim continue to go very well. Bridgette seems to be like a sponge, as she soaks up (and seeks to apply) all that we study. We will also be looking forward to the potential that a couple of other families may move here over the next year or so. That would be another boost to our work here, along with the good things that continue to happen in the community.

Over the last 5 years, we have been very fortunate that the wildfires have been far from us. While there are fires every year, most have been far enough away that we have only experienced some smoke, even if was pretty thick at times. This year, we had a fire much closer to home. It was only about 4 or 5 miles from the house, and we could see it from our neighborhood. It was certainly interesting watching the aircraft work to fight the fires. We are thankful for the firefighters who worked hard to get it under control. While the fire is still not completely out, it is under control. At last report 28 homes burned. We were never in any danger here in the valley, but it was certainly distressing knowing how bad things were getting up on the mountain! Right now, we have a lot of smoke in the air. For a few days, we have had a rating of "unhealthy" air quality, severe enough to encourage people to stay inside as much as possible until it passes. Things like the kids' soccer practice have had to be canceled. As bad as things have been here, it is nothing like the wildfires and smoke savaging Oregon. We have several friends up in that area that have been under evacuation orders for a time. We would

appreciate prayers for all of the areas around the west that are suffering from the fires and smoke. There are a lot of people who are facing difficulties, and a lot of people who are working diligently in dangerous jobs to fight the fires and protect life and property of others.

We had hoped to be able to make at least a short trip this summer, but Covid has kept that from being practical. We are hopeful that things will calm down enough by the end of the year that we will be able to visit family. It will be nice to see everyone again!

Thank you all for your continued encouragement and support of the work we are doing here. It continues to be an exciting and rewarding work, and much good continues to be done. We continue to plant, and trust that God will continue to provide the increase!
