I praised God to witness the power of his word in a seeking heart. Shenita and I are continuing to study together on a weekly basis. Christians in Boston

Recently I was preaching through 1 Peter chapter 5. In this sermon, I shared that the Lord has set up his church to be led by elders. However, in preparing the lesson, I realized that many of these young (in the faith) Christians have never been part of a church with elders, including our congregation in Boston. I explained that this is not the ideal and is not God's desire for his church. Shortly afterwards, I decided to give a lesson from Titus 1:5-9 to teach our men how to become elders. The lesson discussed that we need to prepare now to become the godly leaders of the Lord's church in the future. We need to learn now to be godly leaders in the home, self-controlled, and zealous for God's word.

I followed up that sermon with a lesson geared towards the women of our congregation. This lesson taught that the church needs godly women who are workers. We looked in the book of Acts at the examples of Lydia, Tabitha, and

Priscilla to learn how they helped the kingdom with their devotion to prayer and worship, being selfless and giving, and being able to teach.

I am thankful for the men and women of our congregation who desire to fill these roles in God's kingdom. I am thankful for their encouragement to me and their example to my daughters.
