Dear brothers and sisters, I want to greet you all, hoping that upon receipt of this letter you are all well enjoying the blessings of our beloved God and the Lord Jesus.

- REPORT -

The brothers who are persevering faithful to the Lord are all in good health, thank God, no one has been affected by Covid. If they have fallen ill, they have been with common illnesses, the same as your servant. We have all already been vaccinated, my family and brothers in the faith, with the two corresponding doses. The city in which I live, Comodoro Rivadavia (Argentina), has not detected cases of Covid-12 in the last two weeks, but we still take care of ourselves by observing the required protocols.

LOCAL CHURCH: Regarding the Sunday preaching we have been taking turns with my nephew Franco Del Arco. The brothers Luis Figueroa and Edgardo Correa are active in the service. We continue to distribute invitations to attend church. And encouraging them to have Bible studies in their homes or by video call.

RAWSON'S BROTHERS: Rawson's brothers continue to congregate faithfully. There, apart from the brothers Jorge Sosa and Mabel González who were victims of Covid but who recovered, no other brother was affected. I will be with them on the 20-21 of this month, God permitting.

BROTHERS OF PUNTA ARENAS AND PORVENIR. He continued teaching Bible studies with the brothers who live in Chile, on Wednesdays at 9:00 p.m. These brothers have asked me to visit them, and I have found out that one of them left the church, that is why I am evaluating the possibility of going to visit in December or January 2022, if God allows me. Taking advantage of the opening of the Argentina / Chile borders. I say evaluating because there are things that do not favor, for example that here in Argentina things are increasing greatly, including gasoline and I travel in my car. Another unfavorable thing is that the value of the Argentine peso is very devalued in Chile. If you go it would be only for the weekend (Saturday and Sunday), as it did before the pandemic, this is due to the costs (accommodation, food and gasoline) To give you an idea of the expenses I briefly describe the itinerary: It is 1031 km to Punta Arenas (one way). It's a 12 hour drive by car. They are two days of lodging in Chile and one on the return in Argentina. To go to Porvenir, which is in Tierra del Fuego, you have to take a ferry (round trip). Gasoline and food for two (since I'm going with my wife).

Because the effort to go, they are young brothers in faith and in age. They are geographically very far from other congregations, since they are located in the south of the American continent. They strive to learn (via Zoom) and faithfully persevere in faith. If someone could contribute financially to
be able to visit these brothers, their help would be welcome. Brothers, I say goodbye to you, as always, asking for your prayers. I thank each church and brothers who help me in particular to continue carrying the gospel of Christ in this city. The Lord reward you handsomely. We pray for you so that the Lord will keep you and affirm you so that you can go through this test that we have to pass. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. Your brother in Christ Alejandro Correa greets you!
