It seems that traveling has a tendency to wear down immune systems. Thankfully, we made it home from this trip before coming down with some kind of malady that has caused sore throats and stuffy heads. On our last trip, our return home was delayed because of such an illness. We are certainly thankful to be home, and to have had a safe trip. In all, we traveled over 5000 miles and crossed 13

different states.
