Thank you for your continued interest in the Lord's work in Boston. We are blessed to be here and could not be without your love, support, prayers, and encouragement.


Christians in Boston

I am prayerful that the congregation has been strengthened in the inner man through this study as well, and I am excited to dig into chapters 4-6, beginning in December.
