He associated my belief in baptism for the forgiveness of sins with this group. I told him that I was NOT affiliated with this denomination in any way. Some of you may be aware that the Boston Church of Christ is a part of the International Church of Christ (ICOC). This cult-like religious group has caused controversy throughout the world with their teachings. Their influence and history is well-known around Boston. Sadly, this can be a deterrent for the spread of the gospel in this region. We have met several people who had bad experiences with the Boston Church of Christ, which makes them shy away from studying the Bible.

Dan and I have always met regularly on a weekly basis to discuss our work together and for me to gain some insight and wisdom from him. We were usually trying to fit that time between studies, which meant we would have to cut our time short, or completely, if other things came up. This past month we decided to place more priority on our meetings and move them to Monday mornings, which would allow us opportunity to study and pray together. I have really enjoyed this time, being sharpened by Dan. I appreciate his heart for the Lord and the work that he has been doing in Boston for several years now.
