Our men met together to set up our adult Bible classes for 2019. We just finished studying through the gospels, so this year we will focus on the rest of the New Testament (about 2 chapters of text per class period). We decided to split up the teaching opportunities, and eight of the nine men signed up to teach the Bible classes. If I'm not mistaken, two of the men have never taught an adult class before. It is a blessing to see these men growing and wanting to do more for our group and for the Lord. I really appreciate their servants' hearts.

I signed up to teach Romans and Hebrews this year (two books that I have never taught before). I'm looking forward to the challenge, and I have already begun studying Romans in preparation for the upcoming class.



Another opportunity for our congregation to serve has come by way of some Spanish speaking women who have started worshiping with us. These women had been worshiping on their own for some time with an uncle who was doing the teaching.

However, their uncle suffered a stroke recently, so he has not been able to teach them anymore. They do not live far from our meeting place and have been attending with us for over a month. We are blessed to have several in our congregation who speak Spanish. These individuals have been able to help us enfold these women, as well as sit with the ladies to translate our services for them. We pray that we are encouraging to them and can help them in their worship and service to God.

This past week we were able to get away from the cold & snow for a bit. We flew down to Dallas to spend time with our physical and Christian family there. It was refreshing to spend this time with people we have known and loved for so long, some whom we have not seen since we moved to Boston. I love sharing about the work in Boston and the Christians here with other people. It is fun to see how excited others get about what the Lord is doing in Boston.
