I want to highlight one of the older women of our group because of how encouraging she is to me. Jackie has been a Christian approximately 5 years. She thirsts for knowledge and desires to grow in her weaknesses. When she is in our Bible studies, she always asks great questions. Jackie has many health issues that make it difficult for her to come to Bible class or worship, but it is obvious that she is always trying. For example, this past month Jackie was able to make it out to one of our community studies. In order to get there, she had to order a ride through one of the city's services. This ride service is problematic because it will pick up many other passengers along the route. This particular trip took Jackie 1.5 hours to get to our study location,

which was only a few miles away. Understandably, she was very frustrated by the trip. The next day I received a text from Jackie telling me she felt sorrowful for how she had expressed frustration during her ride instead of using the opportunity to shine His light, and that she was repenting of her attitude. God is so good to forgive us, and His word is powerful to change our hearts!

The women of our congregation host a ladies' retreat for women around the Northeast. This year they invited Beth Works of Elmira, NY and LaDonna Reading of Gettysburg, PA to lead their studies. The topic was "Developing Spiritual Kinship" through a study

of 1 Thessalonians and examination of Paul's relationship with the young Thessalonian church. The ideas of investing in others, giving and receiving encouragement, and looking to the future goal of heaven helped ignite their hearts and minds toward growth in this vital area. The women of our congregation returned with a renewed vigor to dig deeper in their relationships with each other and all brethren.
