Work of Evangelist

We have completed studying the Gospel of John in our virtual Meetup study, and I have been very encouraged by the consistent number of visitors and participation we have had throughout the study. While we were advertising on Facebook, we would average 2 new visitors to the study every week. Towards the end, we had about 6 regular visitors who consistently attended and participated. As the visitors became more consistent, they also grew to be more comfortable with asking questions and engaging with the text. I'm thankful for this time I've had to study with these specific people. This opportunity to reach them probably would not have happened had it not been for the Covid restrictions. I have decided that our next study will be through the book of Romans and look forward to building on the momentum that we've gained.

Liz is a woman in her 60s who I've been studying with 1-on-1 for several months. Before that, she was coming to our Downtown meetup study. Liz was raised Catholic, but as an adult she has taken on more Calvinistic beliefs. Several times during our studies together, she has found that her belief system conflicts with what she reads in Scripture. Unfortunately, this typically results in her trying to push me away and end our study. However, I have always been able to reason with her from the Scripture and our studies will resume. Recently, I invited to of our older women – Sybil and Jackie – to join in the study with Liz. These two women also came to Christ later in life, which

gives them a unique and thoughtful perspective in their study of the Bible. I am hopeful that their influence will be beneficial to Liz.

Please pray for me with this opportunity with Liz, as well as others, that I will speak the truth in love, not growing wearing in well doing.




Christians in Boston
